Hello Athletes, Coaches, and Officials,

Welcome to the 2020 Golden West RoundUp Virtual Presentation. All Year FSC is providing an opportunity for you to present your program(s) and receive feedback and critique from Tech panel and Judges panel.

This is an evaluation/critique event, hosted and run by the All Year Figure Skating Club. we are excited to offer the following:

- **Skaters will receive a standard IJS Protocol sheet with levels identified and Judges GOE and Component scores.**
- **Personal critiques, with a member of the Tech panel and judges panel, for all skaters who sign up for a critique.**

We realize that many skaters have been training and looking forward to events that have now been postponed or cancelled. We are happy to provide an opportunity, for skaters, to present their programs to a tech panel and a panel of judges. Most of this will be done virtually, but we will also try to accommodate a small number of skaters for a "live, in person" evaluation. This feedback can be used to help you train and make necessary adjustments, to your program(s), so that you are more prepared for the next competitive opportunity.

This is a virtual presentation and there are many variables that are outside the scope and realm of our control. Your scores and your protocol sheets should be used as an opportunity for personal growth and improvement. We realize that video submissions will be varied in quality. Viewing angles and lighting can also vary, greatly. Our officials will do their best, to review and evaluate, to the best of their abilities, taking into account, all the variables with which they will be challenged.

While the presentation/critique is not a sanctioned competition, the officials will be officiating in accordance with the rules and regulations as set forth in the current US Figure Skating rulebook, as well as any pertinent updates which have been posted on USFigureskating.org.

RoundUp Information

Golden West RoundUp will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the current rulebook, as well as any pertinent updates which have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating website.

The presentation is open to any eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted person as defined by the Eligibility Rules, and who is a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, a collegiate club or an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. Please refer to the current rulebook for non-U.S. Citizens.

AGE RESTRICTIONS/ELIGIBILITY/TEST LEVEL:

All competitors must be eligible persons and members in good standing of U.S. Figure Skating or a foreign federation by the close of entries. Qualifying tests and ages for all events are as of close of entries Monday, December 10, 2020.

All levels may skate TWO levels higher than that for which they are qualified, but may not skate more than one level in each discipline, except as specifically noted below. Age restrictions apply as follows:

Age Requirements/Restrictions (ALL ages are as of December 10, 2020):

Singles free skate events (Well Balanced Program) have the following requirements:

- Juvenile: Girls – 12 years of age or younger; Boys – 13 years of age or younger
- Open Juvenile: Girls – 13 years of age or older; Boys – 14 years of age or older
- Intermediate must be under the age of 18
- Adults must be 21 years of age or older

ENTRIES: Online registration **opens December 4, 2020**. Entries will be accepted online via Entryeeze, with credit card only. Each transaction includes a credit card fee (<http://www.entryeeze.com> or www.allyearfsc.com and follow link to Entryeeze <http://comp.entryeeze.com/Home.aspx?cid=97>). **Athletes are encouraged to enter as soon as possible as we may need to limit entries.**

Registration Deadline: 11:59 PM (PST) December 10, 2020.
Late Registration will not be accepted for this opportunity.

Athletes are encouraged to enter as soon as possible as we will need to limit space for this opportunity. Processing fees are **not refundable**, even if the event is canceled or skater withdraws or fails to submit video by the deadline. **Credit Card Disputes:** All Year FSC reserves the right to charge an additional fee of \$40.00, in addition to the entry fee to resolve any disputes to the credit card charge. REFUND POLICY: Entry fees will not be refunded after December 10, 2020 unless no presentation opportunity is provided, the event is cancelled or due to maximum event size being reached, entry is not accepted. There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals, nor for failure to upload video. The online processing fees are not refundable, unless entry is not accepted due to maximum capacity.

ENTRY FEES: ALL Registration fees are to be paid with credit card only and include a processing fee.

NOVICE -SENIOR

\$50 per pair – 1st presentation entered

\$50 per pair – 2nd presentation entered

*note – Novice through Senior must enter the “in person” event if they want to be considered for the “in person” scheduling. If “in person” cannot be scheduled, then it will be assumed that a video will be submitted by the athlete.

SHORT PROGRAM & WELL BALANCED FREE SKATE EVENTS will be held as separate presentation opportunities- If you would like to skate and present both your short program and freeskate, each event will need to be entered as an individual event.

SCHEDULE:

Entries will be due by December 10, 2020

Video submission between December 12-17.

December 12 & 13, in person presentations and critiques will be organized for a limited number of athletes at Great Park Ice, Irvine, CA

Virtual evaluations will occur from December 19-20, 2020

Protocol review and skater critiques will be scheduled after December 20, 2020

FACILITIES:

The in person opportunity, as possible, will be held at the Great Park Ice, 888 Ridge Valley, Irvine, CA 92618. The ice surface of Rink 3 & 4 is approximately 85' x 200', slightly rounded at the corners.

LOCKER ROOMS AND CHANGING AREAS:

Due to security and health issues, there will be no changing areas provided.

MUSIC

Athletes who partake in the "in person" opportunity, must upload their music on EntryEeze by the entry deadline of December 10th. Due to Covid-19, personal cell phones will not be an acceptable replacement option at this time. Be sure to have a backup on CD.

VIDEO REQUIREMENTS & RECOMMENDATIONS:

- All video must be recorded between December 12 & 17. Please include a time/date stamp as part of your video, from your phone or tablet, identifying the date/time the video was recorded. **Deadline will be 11:59 pm on December 17.**
- Video must be high or recognizable resolution, .MOV, .M4a or .MP4 File Formats only and no more than 900MB. Technical panel will determine any videos that are deemed "unreviewable". If your video file size is larger, please reach out to us, we would rather have a larger file than a lower resolution file that is harder to see.
- Once you have registered and paid on EntryEeze, you will be asked to upload your video. Click on the "Competition" tab and the select "Performance Video". Only the skater may upload their video – coaches do not have access to video upload.
- Upload the original video, please do not use a video that was sent via text or other methods as it significantly reduces the file and video resolution.
- Skaters should wear their competition attire or black on black. We don't expect you to go out and purchase a brand new dress or skating attire, but would like to help set the tone that this is a video that will be presented to a panel of judges, and will help the skater to be in a competitive mindset as a practice run for the competition season.
- Video submissions will not contain any editing, splicing and must be recorded from one angle. Any videos that are deemed edited will be automatically disqualified. You will be given one chance to resubmit a video, if found to be edited on the second submission the skater will be disqualified and no refunds given.
- The coach or parent, or the skater if an adult, will sign an affidavit that submissions have not been edited.
- We recommend that the person videoing the program, be standing nearest center ice and can clearly record all corners of the ice. NOTE: we recommend a test prior to performance to ensure video quality.
- Some rinks have limitations as to who is allowed in the rink, and on the ice so we know that this may not be achievable. Please do the best you can, given the rules and restrictions in place as your individual rink.
- Please record in landscape mode (not vertical).
- You will not be judged or scored based on the quality or location of video.
- Videos can be recorded with a phone, tablet, camera or computer.
- Do your best to make sure the music is loud enough for the officials to hear when they replay the

videos during the judging process. We recommend you turn up the music when you record the program being skated on the ice.

- Make sure the skater's full body is visible at all times during their skating performance.
- Other skaters and coaches can be on the ice when you record your video, you do not have to rent private ice to record and submit your video.

LIABILITY: U.S. Figure Skating, All Year FSC, and Great Park Ice accept no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in this competition. This is in accordance with Rule 1600 of the official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.

JUDGING SYSTEM:

The International Judging System (IJS) will be used for the following events:

- *Well Balanced Program free skate events: pre-preliminary, preliminary, pre-juvenile, open juvenile, juvenile, intermediate, novice, junior and senior*
- *Short program events, Intermediate – Senior*
- *Pairs free skate events, Juvenile – Senior*
- *Pairs short program events, Novice – Senior*
- *Adult Bronze, Adult Silver, Adult Gold, Adult Masters combined*

PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT (PPC)

Athletes participating in this presentation/critique must submit the planned program content form online. This form is found in the Entryeze registration system. The deadline to submit the form is the entry deadline, **December 10, 2020**. The LOC will assess each competitor/team and additional charge, \$25.00 per segment, if the athlete/team fails to upload the PPC form by the deadline, **December 10, 2020**.

CRITIQUES:

We will be offering a critique for all skaters, from Pre-Preliminary to Senior. All efforts will be made to schedule critiques between December 20 and December 30, 2020. If you want the critique, we ask that you sign up for the event **with** the critique included.

PHOTOGRAPHY/VIDEOGRAPHY:

Coronado Video <https://www.coronadoproductions.net/> will be the official videographer. A professional photographer <http://cynthiaslawterphotography.com/> for action photographs will be at the rink. No photography or videotaping, except by the official photographer, without the express permission of the person being photographed or videotaped is allowed.

Singles Free Skating Events (Well-balanced)

See current [rulebook](#) or for current requirements for Short Program and Well Balance Freeskate, log in to Members Only, go to SKATING OPPORTUNITIES, choose the appropriate discipline, review skating rules and resources.

Senior Free Skate: Must have passed the Novice Free Skating Test. This shall be skated in accordance with 6400.

Junior Free Skate: Must have passed the Intermediate Free Skating Test, but not the Senior Free Skating Test. This shall be skated in accordance with 6420.

Novice Free Skate: Must have passed the Juvenile Free Skating Test, but not the Junior Free Skating Test. This shall be skated in accordance with 6430.

Intermediate Free Skate: Must have passed the Pre-Juvenile Free Skating Test, but not the Novice Free Skating Test. This shall be skated in accordance with 6440.

Juvenile Free Skate: Must have passed the Preliminary Free Skating Test, but not the Intermediate Free Skating Test. This shall be skated in accordance with 6450.

Open Juvenile Free Skate: Must have passed the Preliminary Free Skating Test, but not the Intermediate Free Skating Test. This shall be skated in accordance with 6450.

Pre-Juvenile Free Skate: Must have passed the Pre-Preliminary Free Skating Test, but not the Juvenile Free Skating Test. This shall be skated in accordance with 6460.

Preliminary Free Skate: Must not have passed the Pre-Juvenile Free Skating Test. This shall be skated in accordance with 6470.

Pre-Preliminary Free Skate: Must not have passed the Preliminary Free Skating Test. This shall be skated in accordance with 6480.

Singles Short Program Events (Well Balanced)

Pairs Events

Test and Age Eligibility Requirements (Short Program/Free Skating)

Juvenile: Open to pairs who have not passed the Intermediate Pair test or as per Rule 7450.

Intermediate: Open to pairs who have not passed the Intermediate Pair Test, or pursuant to Rule 7440.

Novice: Open to pairs who have passed Juvenile Pair Test, but no higher than Novice Pair test or pursuant to Rule 7430

Junior: Open to pairs who have passed the Intermediate Pair test, but have not passed the Senior Pair test or pursuant to Rule 7420

Senior: Must have passed the Novice Pair Test or higher

Pairs Short Program and Free Skate Events

Pairs events will be conducted in accordance with the U.S. Figure Skating rulebook. Athletes and coaches are responsible for going to the U.S. Figure Skating rulebook for rules, program length, etc. and as updated in the Technical Information section on the U.S. Figure Skating website. - Novice short program – Rule 7431
- Junior short program – Rule 7421
- Senior short program – Rule 7411

Adult Free Skate Events

Test and Age Eligibility Requirements (Short Program/Free Skating)

A. **Adult Bronze**– Rule 6550. Open to skaters who have passed no higher than Adult Bronze Free Skating Test or the USFS Preliminary Free Skating Test

B. **Adult Silver**– Rule 6540

Open to skaters who have passed no higher than the USFS Adult Silver Free skating test or the USFS Juvenile Free skating test.

C. **Adult Gold** – Rule 6530. Open to skaters who have passed the USFS Adult Bronze Free skating test or USFS Adult Gold Free skating test or the USFS Juvenile Free skating test.

D. **Adult Masters** – Rules 6510 – 6520. Open to skaters who have passed at least the USFS Intermediate Free skating test and/or prior to October 1, 1977, the third Figure Test.

Adult events will be conducted in accordance with the U.S. Figure Skating rulebook. Athletes and coaches are responsible for going to the U.S. Figure Skating rulebook for rules, program length, etc. and as updated in the Technical Information section on the U.S. Figure Skating website.
