I. COMPETITION OVERVIEW

The Sweetheart Classic will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the [current rulebook](#), and/or current Compete USA handbook as well as any pertinent updates that have been posted in the Members' Only portal on the U.S. Figure Skating [website](#).

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules. Skaters must be a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating club, Learn to Skate USA member, a collegiate club or who is an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. II. ELIGIBILITY

AGE RESTRICTIONS/ELIGIBILITY/TEST LEVEL

This competition is open to all synchronized teams comprised of members who are eligible as defined by the Eligibility Rules, and currently registered members in good standing of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, a collegiate club, or an individual member in accordance with the current U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook. Refer to the current rulebook regarding eligibility of non-U.S. citizens.

- Moves in the field test requirements are as of the entry deadline.

- Events will be held in accordance with the rules of the United States Figure Skating Association per the 2026 Rulebook and per the 2025-2026 Competition Rules contained therein, except as otherwise stated herein and/or modified at the 2023 U.S. Figure Skating Governing Council Meeting, U.S. Figure Skating Technical Notifications for the appropriate discipline, ISU Communications for Juniors and Seniors and as otherwise stated herein.
- Ages for entrants are as of close of entries January 22, 2026.

QUALIFYING ROUNDS

The 2026 Sweetheart Classic will not hold any Qualifying Rounds for any level of any event. If there are sufficient entries, Pre-Juvenile and below may be split by age; Juvenile and above will be seeded per current US Figure Skating seeding rules. There will not be any Final Rounds.

III. REGISTRATION INFORMATION:

ONLINE REGISTRATION VIA ENTRYEEZE

Entries must be submitted online via Entryeeze ([Entryeeze](#)) by midnight (PDT) January 22, 2026. All Year FSC requires “on-line” entry. Entries will be accepted online via EntryEeze with credit card only. Each transaction includes a credit card fee. Processing fees are not refundable, even if the event is canceled or team withdraws before close of entries. REFUND POLICY

Entry fees will not be refunded after January 22, 2026, unless no competition exists, or the event is canceled. There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals.

ADMISSION

No admission will be charged to the general public for viewing the competition.

CREDENTIALS

Each team will receive a maximum of four coach credentials and two team service personnel credentials, as well as one credential for each skater on the competition roster. To receive a credential at the competition, team personnel (coaches and team service personnel) and any mandatory athletes must meet all compliance requirements for the current season.

All team personnel and skaters who will need to receive a credential must be listed in the Team Portal for the competition (Team Personnel for coaches and team managers; Competition Roster for skaters and alternates).

The Local Organizing Committee (LOC)/club will have a list of team personnel who are cleared for a credential at the competition. Team personnel will need to check in at the event registration desk and show a government issued photo ID to receive a credential. Team personnel who are NOT on the list will need to show proof of compliance, as required by your role with the team, and a photo ID at check-in.

If any team personnel cannot provide a photo ID and is not on the list or cannot produce the necessary documents, they will not be allowed a credential – no exceptions. We strongly urge all team personnel to have their compliance cards with them. Non-credentialed coaches will not be permitted in the designated coaching area at rink side during events, including practice sessions. Non-credentialed team personnel will not be permitted in any team designated areas.

The LOC/club will also have a list of mandatory athletes who are cleared for a credential at the competition. Mandatory athletes will not be required to check-in independently from the team, but the athletes' credentials should be pulled, and the team flagged for review at check-in. Any mandatory athlete that cannot provide proof of SafeSport completion will not be allowed a credential or participation in the competition – no exceptions. We strongly urge all team managers and mandatory athletes to maintain a copy of proof of compliance with them at the time of check-in.

MANDATORY ATHLETES

This event is a standard U.S. Figure Skating Nonqualifying Competition

Athletes age 18+ as of the competition start date who will be competing on a team (i.e., synchro, ice dance, pairs) with at least one Minor Athlete must complete SafeSport™ Training.

Minor athletes who turn 18 mid-season are encouraged to seek parental consent to take the online SafeSport™ Training early to avoid any disruptions in their ability to participate as the training is required upon turning 18. The athlete will not be SkateSafe compliant until they have completed the training and their Members Only portal reflects completion. MUSIC SUBMISSION/UPLOAD

Online music submission is the ONLY acceptable method to submit program music. After you have paid for your events, the system will prompt you to upload your music for each event that requires music. If your music is not available at that time, you can logout of your account and return later to upload your music by going to the "Competition" tab and then selecting "My Music." Please be sure you are uploading the correct music for the correct event segment. Be careful, for example, not to mix up your short program and your free skate!

Competitors must also have available a backup copy of their competition music on a cell phone or flash drive and it must be immediately available rink side whenever the skater competes. If the phone does not have the standard round headset connector (AUX input), an appropriate adapter, such as an Apple Lightning connector or Samsung USB-C adapter is required to be attached. The phone should be presented to the music person with the file ready to play, phone in airplane mode and volume turned to maximum.

The LOC, competition officials, and volunteers exercise reasonable care when handling personal cell phones or flash drives, however, they are not responsible for damage to or loss of any music playing device. The LOC is not responsible for devices not picked up by the end of the competition.

- **Penalty for Incorrect Music or Failure to Upload Music**
 - The LOC may assess each competitor/team an additional charge, of \$40.00 per event segment, if the competitor/team: 1) fails to submit their music prior to the close of online music submission, 2) submits files that do not follow the specifications above, or 3) uploads the incorrect music for a given event segment (e.g. uploads short program music instead of the free skate). In the event the LOC decides to assess a penalty, the competitor/teams will not receive their credentials at registration until they pay the penalty fee and turn in their music on CD, conforming to the requirements above.

PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT (PPC) SUBMISSION/UPLOAD (FOR IJS EVENTS ONLY)

Competitors participating in IJS events must submit PPC via Entryeeze no later than **February 7, 2026; 11:59PM PDT**. After this date, teams will be subject to a \$40 late fee. The late fee will automatically be added to each team's cart who doesn't meet this requirement by the deadline.

IV. COMPETITION DETAILS:

FACILITIES

The competition will be held at The Rinks - Lakewood ICE, 3975 Pixie Ave., Lakewood, CA 90712. The ice surface is approximately 85' x 200', slightly rounded at the corners. The arena has restrooms, a cafe, a pro shop and free parking. There are restaurants within driving distance of the arena.

LOCKER ROOMS AND CHANGING AREAS

Locker rooms and changing areas will not be available this competition. All athletes are expected to arrive at the arena ready (costumes, hair, make-up etc.). Athletes will be provided with an area to put skates on, but changing will not be permitted in these spaces. All doors to the available locker rooms must be kept open at all times and are used for storage of skates, and equipment only.

OFFICIAL NOTICES

An official posting area will be maintained inside the lobby area of the arena. The official schedule of events will be posted on Entryeze and the All Year FSC website (www.alleyearfsc.com). It is the responsibility of each competitor, parent and coach to check the bulletin board and websites listed above frequently for any schedule changes and/or additional information. During the competition, updates will be posted through the on-line portal and will supersede all other schedules. Notices posted on the All Year FSC website will be considered sufficient notice to all skaters. No schedules will be mailed. Skaters are requested to arrive 45 minutes prior to the scheduled time of their event. A tentative schedule of events will be posted as noted above prior to the competition.

Online results will be available during the competition. A QR code, for access, will be provided and posted throughout the building.

SCHEDULE

Competitors may be scheduled at any time for the announced date of the competition. Notification of competition and practice ice times will be available by email and on Entryeze and on the AYFSC website links (<http://www.alleyearfsc.com>). This will be considered sufficient notification of the scheduled events.

PRACTICE ICE

Depending on the number of applicants, practice ice for the competition may be offered. If offered, final details for scheduling practice ice will be made available to competitors through Entryeze. (Approximate Sales opening date: January 28, 2026) Music will not be played on Practice Ice.

ONSITE CHECK-IN

Check-in will open on Sunday, February 22, 2026, at approximately 7:00 am and will be

located inside the main entrance to the ice arena.

AWARDS

Awards will be presented for the first four placed teams in each event level/group. There will be no Final Rounds at this event.

PHOTOGRAPHY/VIDEOGRAPHY

Coronado Video (<http://coronadoproductions.tripod.com>) will be the official videographer. Cynthia Slawter Photography is the professional photographer (<http://cynthiaslawterphotography.com>) for award and action photographs will be at the rink. All other videotaping and photography is restricted to hand-held battery operated equipment, without tripod. No photography or videotaping, except by the official photographer, without the express permission of the person being photographed or videotaped is allowed.

Solicitation by any photographer, or agent, of anyone to be the subject of still or video photography is not permitted. NO FLASH PHOTOGRAPHY DURING THE EVENTS IS ALLOWED.

NOTE: per U.S. Figure Skating policy, photographing and/or recording of anyone other than your own team is strictly prohibited.

COACHES

To be considered compliant, coaches must identify as a coach within their [Members Only](#) profile and complete the requirements by July 1 of each year (July 1, 2025). Coaches who have completed their compliance requirements are advised to have a copy of their membership and compliance cards with them at all sanctioned activities and events. The LOC will have a list of compliant coaches who are approved to receive a credential at the competition. Coaches will need to check in at the event registration desk and show a government issued photo I.D. to receive a credential. If a coach cannot provide a photo I.D. and is not on the list or cannot produce the necessary documents, he or she will not be allowed a credential. There can be no exceptions to this policy.

If a foreign coach has only foreign athletes at this competition, a background check and SafeSport Training is not required. Instead, the coach must submit a letter from their Federation stating they are a member in good standing. U.S. FIGURE SKATING TRAVEL POLICY

All travel must strictly adhere to Two-Deep Leadership requirements. An Adult Participant cannot transport a Minor Athlete one-on-one and Two-Deep Leadership requirements must be adhered to at all times during In-Program travel, by transporting at least two minors or a second Adult Participant. An Adult Participant cannot share a hotel room or other sleeping arrangement with a Minor Athlete(s).
