I. COMPETITION OVERVIEW

The 2026 CURTAIN CALL will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the current [rulebook](#), current [Compete USA Showcase](#) and [Compete USA Theater on Ice](#) handbooks, [2025- 2026 National Showcase Guidelines](#), [2025-2026 Theatre on Ice Guidelines](#) as well as any pertinent updates that have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating [website](#).

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules.

Each skater must be a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, Learn to Skate USA member, an Aspire member, a collegiate club or an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. For non-U.S. citizens, please refer to the [rulebook](#) for more information.

Judging and Marking:

The CJS Judging system will be used for all events Preliminary and up. Depending on time, the chief referee and chief scoring official will determine whether Aspire 1 through Pre-Preliminary

will be evaluated using CJS or 6.0. For each performance, three Program Component marks will be awarded by each judge on a scale of 0.25 to 10.

1. Artistic Appeal with Innovation & Creativity (applied factor 40%)
 2. Performance & Projection: Universe, Musicality and Feeling (applied factor 35%)
 3. Showcase Skating Skills (applied factor 25%)
- No technical skating mark will be awarded.

 - *The 6.0 system of judging will be used for all **Compete USA** events with one mark awarded. No technical mark will be awarded.*

II. ELIGIBILITY

TEST LEVEL:

All competitors/teams must be eligible persons and members in good standing of U.S. Figure Skating by the close of entries. Qualifying tests and ages for all events are as of close of entries Friday, March 13, 2026.

All skaters may not skate more than one level in each discipline, except as specifically noted below. Age restrictions apply as identified in the "Events" section. For Duets, entries must be according to the age and level of the highest test skater. Both skaters must have completed test minimum prerequisites. ALL ages are as of Friday, March 13, 2026.

Skaters may enter any or all singles events for which they are qualified by test level or one level higher. Skaters cannot skate in different levels of the same event (example: A Character Junior level skater would not be allowed to skate Character Junior and Senior).

Skaters/teams entering SnowplowSam through pre-juvenile events will be divided as closely as possible by age at the discretion of the referee. If necessary, the referee will combine any events as needed based on entries.

Juvenile through Senior Elite events will be divided by draw.

Eligibility will be based on skill level as of the closing date of entries. It is very important to the success of the competition that skaters are placed in the correct divisions. If, for whatever reason, the Local Organizing Committee discovers that a skater or team has been placed in a category that is below their class level, the referee will have the option to move the skater or team into the proper division, even if this has to be done the day of the competition. This will ensure that every event is as fair as possible to the competitors. Please be sure to check for the

'director's/instructor's level of skater confirmation' on EntryEeze.



COACHES

To be an eligible coach at a non-qualifying competition, coaches must meet the applicable compliance requirements and be verified by U.S. Figure Skating. Coach compliance falls into three categories, Coach/Choreographer, Learn to Skate USA Instructor, or Foreign Coach/Choreographer. Details regarding compliance requirements can be found [HERE](#). All compliance requirements must be met at the time of check-in to access the competition, no exceptions.

In order to be considered compliant, coaches must identify as a coach within their Members Only profile and complete the following requirements by July 1 of each year:

Coaches can choose their CEUs: 1 CEU earned per live webinar or watching a recorded webinar, 2 CEUs earned per eLearning course, 10 CEUs earned for the National Coaches College; additional in-person learning, per event. Coaches may work on CEUs throughout the season and "bank" up to 10 CEUs for the subsequent season. CEUs are accessed and tracked through the Coach Profile on Members Only.

**CEUs pertain to returning coaches. In their first season as a coach, coaches must pass the Coach Core Certification course via members only to access Coach I.C.E. This is a once-in-a-career requirement. ** Coaches who take the core certification and subsequently join Coach I.C.E., automatically fulfill the CEU requirement for the current season they are in. (i.e., if a new coach takes the Core in January, and joins Coach I.C.E., they automatically receive 10 CEUs to take them through the current season until June 30).*

****Note:** The Coach Core Certification is a once-in-a-career online course divided into five sections reflecting the core values of U.S. Figure Skating: Community, Resilience, Integrity, Respect, and Excellence. These sections feature modules that cover the key fundamentals that every figure skating coach should understand such as Athlete Health and Well-Being, Creating a Positive Sport Experience, Professionalism, Delivery of Feedback, Growth and Development, Training Basics and General Technique Concepts. (Note: Completion of this certification demonstrates a coach's understanding of the topics above, it does not ensure compliance with the U.S. Figure Skating Rules and policies).

2025-2026 Learn To Skate USA Instructor Requirements

2025-26 U.S. Learn to Skate USA Instructor Requirements and Recommendations

This chart displays the requirements for being compliant as a Learn to Skate Instructor. Compliant Learn to Skate Instructors can coach Learn to Skate USA group classes, coach students at Compete USA competitions, and coach at club events (with the permission of the club). Coaches with full U.S. Figure Skating Coach Compliance may also coach at Compete USA competitions.

Learn to Skate USA Instructors are not required to take the Coach Core Certification or join Coach I.C.E. if they are participating under the umbrella of the Learn to Skate USA / Compete USA programs. Instructors who are also coaches should join Coach I.C.E. before beginning their Background Check, as the cost is included with Coach I.C.E. membership.

**The Learn to Skate USA Instructor Certification is an online course designed to support instructors in successfully delivering the curriculum within the Learn to Skate USA program. Completion of this course demonstrates an instructor's understanding of the key topics, it does not ensure compliance with U.S. Figure Skating rules and policies.*

Team Service Personnel:

Teams are permitted a maximum of two team service personnel. Team service personnel must have a green lighted background check and completed SafeSport™ training. All compliance requirements must be met at the time of check-in to access the competition, no exceptions. Team service personnel is defined as those indicated as a team manager and/or team service personnel planning to attend the competition with the team.

SafeSport™ Mandatory Athlete Compliance:

Athletes age 18+ as of the competition start date who will be competing on a team (i.e., synchro, ice dance, pairs, shadow dance, theatre, etc.) with at least one Minor Athlete must complete SafeSport™ Training. *

Minor athletes who turn 18 mid-season are encouraged to seek parental consent to take the online SafeSport™ Training early to avoid any disruptions in their ability to participate as the training is required upon turning 18. The athlete will not be SkateSafe compliant until they have completed the training and their Members Only portal reflects completion. III. REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Entries and Entry Fees:

All applications must be completed online at: www.entryeeze.com

Entry Deadline: Friday, March 13, 2026, 11:59pm

Late Entries (***if space is available***) will be accepted no later than Wednesday, March 18, 2026 at 11:59 PM with a \$50.00 late fee.

Entry Verification/ Coach Approval/ Entry Change Fee:

The information on the entry must be accurate and complete. Coaches must either approve the entries or send back a message correcting the entry by Tuesday, March 17, 2026. There will be no charges for any changes that are necessary prior to this deadline. No changes will be accepted after Wednesday, March 18, 2026.

Additional Information:

- Events will be held in accordance with the rules of the United States Figure Skating Association per the [2025-2026 Rulebook](#) and per the 2025-2026 Competition rules contained therein except as otherwise stated herein and/or modified at the 2026 U.S. Figure Skating Governing Council Meeting.
- Ages for entrants are as of Friday, March 13, 2026.
- At the discretion of the Chief Referee, events may be combined, depending on the number of entries. Events may be combined or canceled if there are two or fewer competitors. Most events will be held with one participant if CJS protocols are offered. Competitors may still qualify for National Showcase even if they are the only entrant in the event. Please see below for more information on National Showcase.
- AGE AND TEST RESTRICTIONS APPLY AS NOTED.

Admission Fee:

Admission for non-credentialed persons is free of charge.

Credentials:

- Competitors will receive one (1) credential at no charge.
- One (1) USFSA credentialed coach per skater/team will receive a credential at no charge (credential must be requested during entry process on EntryEeze).
- Additional coach or chaperone credentials per skater may be requested (credential must be requested during entry process on EntryEeze).

MUSIC SUBMISSION/UPLOAD:

Online music submission through Entry-eeze is the ONLY acceptable method to submit program music. After you have paid for your events, the system will prompt you to upload your music for each event that requires music. If your music is not available at that time, you can

logout of your account and return later to upload your music by going to the "Competition" tab and then selecting "My Music." Please be sure you are uploading the correct music for the correct event segment.

Deadline for uploading music is Sunday, April 5, 2026 11:59pm. Please MAKE SURE to listen to uploaded music for the DURATION of the program to ensure the entire piece has uploaded correctly.

The uploaded program music MUST conform to the following specifications:

- Programs per file: One [1] - Only one piece of competition program music (e.g., Free Skate) per file is allowed.
- File Format: mp3 - The uploaded file music must be an mp3 file (MPEG-1 or MPEG-2 Audio Layer III). Simply changing the file extension to "mp3" from another file format is not acceptable.
- Bit Rate: 192 kbps is requested (bit rates between 128 and 320 kbps will be accepted).
- Maximum file size: 10 MB
- ID3 Metadata [tags]: None - The Chief Music Coordinator ***strongly recommends*** that mp3 files DO NOT contain any ID3 metadata, commonly called tags. This is especially true of any embedded images such as album cover art, picture of the skater, etc. Please, NO EMBEDDED IMAGES!

Backup Music at Event:

In addition to submitting the music online, all competitors/ teams ***must also have*** at least one backup copy of their competition music at rinkside, during the actual competition event. Backup music must meet the following requirements:

- First backup option: A flash drive with the skater's name and event clearly labeled.
- Last backup option: A smartphone with the skater's name and event clearly labeled.
- If the music cannot be played, the skater will be withdrawn.

Penalty for Incorrect Music or Failure to Upload Music:

The LOC will assess each competitor/team an additional charge of \$25 per event segment if the competitor/team:

- 1) fails to submit their music prior to the close of online music submission
- 2) submits files that do not follow the specifications above
- 3) uploads the incorrect music for a given event segment

The competitor/teams will ***not receive their credentials at registration*** until they pay the penalty fee and turn in their music.

REFUND POLICY

Entry fees can only be refunded prior to close of entries unless the event is canceled.

There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals. The online processing fees are not refundable. Checks returned for non-sufficient funds and contested credit card charges will be issued a \$75.00 fee. Payment of the fee will be required before the skater/team is allowed to participate in practice ice or events. Notification of competition and practice ice times will be available by email, on Entryeeze and on the AYFSC website links. This will be considered sufficient notification of the scheduled events.

LIABILITY:

U.S. Figure Skating, Learn to Skate USA, All Year FSC and Iceoplex Simi Valley accept no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in this competition. This is in accordance with Rule 1600 of the official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.

IV. COMPETITION DETAILS

FACILITIES:

The competition will be held at Simi Valley Iceoplex, 131 West Easy Street, Simi Valley, CA 93065. The ice surface is approximately 200' x 96', slightly rounded at all corners. The Olympic size rink (200'x96') will have an approximate performance size of 170' x 90' due to the showcase curtains installed for the event. The rink has limited ready rooms, a snack bar, pro shop, and free parking. There are restaurants within driving distance of the arena.

READY ROOMS FOR TEAMS:

"Ready Rooms" will be available for all skaters. Separate locker rooms for teams will not be available for this event.

Please Note:

- Doors will remain open at all times.
- All participants must adhere to the guidelines set forth by USFS.



- Failure to comply with these guidelines will result in the immediate closure of the rooms and removal of access.

This event will follow the [Holding and Ready Rooms Policy](#).

U.S. Figure Skating Travel Policy: All travel must strictly adhere to Two-Deep Leadership requirements. An Adult Participant cannot transport a Minor Athlete one-on-one and Two-Deep Leadership requirements must be adhered to at all times during In-Program travel, by transporting at least two minors or a second Adult Participant. An Adult Participant cannot share a hotel room or other sleeping arrangement with a Minor Athlete(s). Official Website & Notices:

An official bulletin board will be maintained inside the lobby area of the arena. The official schedule of events will be posted on EntryEeze and the All Year FSC website (www.allyearfsc.com). It is the responsibility of each competitor, team, parent and coach to frequently check the websites listed above for any schedule changes and/or additional information. During the competition, updates, start orders and results will be distributed via a QR code. Notices posted here are considered sufficient notice to all skaters. No schedules will be mailed. Skaters/teams are requested to arrive and check-in 45 minutes prior to the scheduled time of their event. A tentative schedule of events will be posted electronically as noted above prior to the competition.

SCHEDULE

Competitors may be scheduled on any day or time during the announced dates of the competition. The competition and practice ice schedule will be available after the close of entries. All participants will be notified via email once available.

PRACTICE ICE

Depending on the number of applicants, practice ice for the competition may be offered. If offered, practice ice will be with or without spotlights. Spotlight practices will be filled on a first come first serve basis. If offered, final details for scheduling practice ice will be made available to the competitors through EntryEeze.

ONSITE CHECK-IN:

Registration:

A registration desk will be set up in the lobby of Iceoplex Simi Valley during the competition. All skaters/teams are required to **check-in a minimum of 45 minutes prior** to the scheduled time for their event.

AWARDS:

Awards will be presented for the first four placed skaters/teams in each event level/group. All skaters tied for a place will be awarded a medal for that place and there will be no tie breaking. There will be no final rounds.

Stillwell Award Championship Production/TOI/Ensemble trophy sponsored by AYFSC

Production/TOI/Ensemble will not reskate. The highest scoring team will receive the Stillwell Championship Ensemble Award and be notified after all team events conclude.

Championship Trophy Reskates:

Stillwell Award Championship singles trophy sponsored by AYFSC

The highest scoring finishing solos (across genres) in **Preliminary – Senior Elite**, will be eligible for an invitation to participate in the Championship Trophy reskate for the perpetual **Stillwell Award** at the conclusion of the competition.

Richard Dwyer Award sponsored by Culver Ice Productions

The highest scoring finishing solos **Adult Bronze - Adult Masters**, will be eligible for

an invitation to participate in the Championship Trophy reskate for the perpetual **Richard Dwyer Award** at the conclusion of the competition.

Slinger Award duet/trio trophy sponsored by Kemper Choreo Company

The highest scoring finishing duets/trios (across genres) in **Preliminary – Senior Elite**, will be eligible for an invitation to participate in the Championship Trophy reskate for the perpetual **Slinger Award** at the conclusion of the competition.

The Championship Trophy participant list will be posted via QR code after the last event in that level, eg - after all Junior solo events have been skated.

PHOTOGRAPHY & VIDEOGRAPHY:

Videos, action photography, and podium shot photography will be available for purchase from a professional video and photography company. The LOC restricts personal videotaping to your skater only. No photography, or videotaping, except by the official photographer, without express permission of the person being photographed, is allowed. NO FLASH photography during the events is allowed.

"Live and on-demand streaming, and sales and distribution of U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned and approved events, programs, and activities that include the playback of music is strictly prohibited. This prohibition does not apply to the distribution of footage that does not include music. Questions about this can be directed to music@usfigureskating.org."
